SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

I. Student Population / Area Covered:

- A. ALL high schools within the counties that has members in the club.
- B. College students nominated by club members who are not previous winners.

II. Guide lines / Rules:

- A. Must be a graduating senior in the year scholarship application is made, or a college student nominated by a club member who is not a previous winner.
- B. Must be planning to pursue a B.S. Degree in Agriculture or an Agriculture related field.
- C. Must attend a Kentucky Public College or University.
- D. Must have a financial need, verified by the school counselor or a Club member.

III. Application Process:

- A. Application forms are available from the approved schools and from any club member.
- B. Applicant must submit an application using the form provided by the set time guideline.
- C. Applicant must submit an attached two to three page typed essay on why applicant has chosen the field of study they are pursuing and how they plan to use the scholarship funds to help finance their education.
- D. Application must have the signature of the school counselor or a supporting Club member.

IV. Selection & Presentation:

- A. Applications must be in to the club by the set time line in order to be considered.
- B. Each application must have an approval signature, either by the school counselor or a club member.
- C. All approved applications will be reviewed by a Club Scholarship Chairperson and if complete, presented to club membership for a vote.
- D. Based on the merits contained in the application, written essay, and financial need, the club membership will by majority vote at the May meeting, chose the winner.
- E. The Cub President or Scholarship Chairperson will inform the winner and their school that they have won.
- F. A Club member will present a Scholarship Certificate or be present when the school makes the presentation on Awards night.

V. Scholarship Amount: \$750.00 Annual Scholarship.

- A. This scholarship is intended to be an annual event provided club finances are available. The club will vote each year on the scholarship as an item of business.
- B. The \$750.00 check will be awarded to the winner at the School Award Program if one is held, or privately if no school award program.
