What is “Power Up Bullpup Program”

It's an afterschool program that is offered to students K-5 for the 2019-2020 school year as a part of the 21st Century Community Learning Center grant. The afterschool program will be offered to students that will benefit from academic assistance and enrichment activities. The program staff consists of Director/Site coordinator, teachers and volunteers from within the community.

Students will receive homework help and work on their reading and math skills to meet grade level benchmarks or extend current performance levels. Additionally, students will be able to participate in clubs and enrichment activities that are hands on, interactive, creative, engaging and apply knowledge and skills. There is a heavy emphasis on STEAM, character building, innovation and technology, Art, and health/fitness/sports.
