G. C. Burkhead believes setting high expectations for academic performance, leadership, and citizenship is key to student success. Our honor roll policy supports the belief and gives us the opportunity to recognize those students who have excelled in all three areas.

Honor Roll Policy

All fourth and fifth grade students are eligible to be honored in the G. C. Burkhead Honor Roll each grading period as long as the following criteria are met:

- a.) Fifth grade students must make all A's, or all A's and B's during each grading period in reading, English/writing, spelling, math, social studies, science/health, and arts & humanities.
- b.) Fourth grade students must make all A's, or all A's and B's during each grading period in reading, English/writing/spelling, math, social studies, science/health, and practical living/vocational studies.
- c.) Fourth and fifth grade students must make all outstanding or satisfactory progress in the following areas: art, music, fine arts, process lab, physical education, and conduct.
- d.) Any fourth or fifth grade student at G. C. Burkhead who maintains all A's or A's and/or B's in a grading period and receives a mark of outstanding or satisfactory in the aforementioned special areas will be eligible to be honored on the G. C. Burkhead Honor Roll during that grading period.
- e.) All students who achieve a final average of "A" in all classes for the school year, and have received outstanding or satisfactory progress marks in the following special areas: art, music, fine arts, process lab, physical education, and conduct, will be eligible to receive a gold medallion at the conclusion of the school year.
- f.) All students who achieve a final average of "A and/or B" in all classes for the school year, and have received outstanding or satisfactory progress marks in the following special areas: art, music, fine arts, process lab, physical education, and conduct will be eligible to receive a silver medallion at the conclusion of the school year.
